OUR HISTORY

The history of the Magnolia Chapter of The Links, Incorporated emerged as a metamorphosis of the Magnolia Club, organized September 1986,7 by a group of women committed to improving the quality of services extended to black youth and their families. The organizer of this community service organization was Willie M. Allen. The Magnolia Club's first comprehensive community service project, inspired by club member the late Judge Romae Powell, was presented at the Fulton County Juvenile Court.

During the next several years, the Club continued and expanded its community service outreach to include services to several schools in the Atlanta system as well as give volunteer and financial support to the National Black Arts Festival, the Hammonds House, the High Museum of Art, the NAACP and the United Negro College Fund. As a result, the Magnolia Club received positive local and national recognition, including the National Links, Inc. conferring official status on the Club as an Interest Group, effective November 1989. Since its inception, the Magnolia Chapter of The Links, Incorporated has been led by dynamic women, each one raising the awareness and impact of The Magnolia Chapter of The Links, Incorporated within the community and the National Links, Inc., with their very own distinct and effective style.



For the past 25 years, the Magnolia (GA) Chapter of The Links, Incorporated has enjoyed a strong tradition of friendship and a rich history of service to the Greater Atlanta community. Consistent with the National thrust, the Magnolia Chapter focuses its efforts on five facets which include Services to Youth, The Arts, National Trends and Services, International Trends and Services, and Health and Human Services. Through our National

Trends Facet, we are focused on the problem of human trafficking and its impact on our young women. On an international level, we support the Schools in Jamaica program. Among our premier programs is the Magnolia Stars, a mentoring and enrichment program for young ladies attending the Coretta Scott King Women's Leadership Academy.



SCHOLARSHIPS

The Magnolia Scholars is a merit-based scholarship program where the Magnolia (GA) Links contribute 20,000\$ to 30,000\$ annually to support students attending a Historically Black College or University (HBCU). Morehouse, Spelman, Howard, Albany State, and Florida Agricultural and Mechanical University (FAMU) are a few of the colleges and universities with recipients earning this scholarship.

The Chapter has provided more than 100,000\$ in scholarships for books, luggage, and other items for students and graduates known as "The Magnolia Stars" at the Coretta Scott King Young Women's Leadership Academy (CSKYWLA). It is a STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) Program in the Atlanta Public School System. The Magnolia Stars Program has been recognized throughout our organization as a "Best Practices" model.



CRIME PREVENTION

The Magnolia Chapter has helped organize and educate over 2,000 students through the initiative, "Know Your Rights." This is a focused anti-gun-violence program, which enables students to benefit from activities with law enforcement officers, attorneys and others in legal fields, as well as from formerly incarcerated individuals.



HEALTH CARE

The Magnolia Chapter has partnered with Grady Health System to provide free transportation to women to receive free mammograms. Chapter members have also volunteered and actively supported the community work of Morehouse School of Medicine.

HUMAN TRAFFICKING

The Chapter has provided more than 60,000\$ to assist in the eradication of human trafficking in Georgia by partnering with other community organizations to provide survivors with shelter, counseling, and other resources. The signature program, "Hidden in Plain Sight", has been met with critical success.



INTERNATIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Its "Books for Africa" program has resulted in the donation, packing, and shipping of over 22,000 books to provide educational resources for underprivileged children in Africa. Support for the Helene Mills Multi-Purpose Center in Haiti has underwritten the making of dresses for girls. "Education Across the Miles" in Soweto, South Africa facilitated programs there.

Through the CSKYWLA, the Chapter has mentored twenty girls from their 9th grade to 12th grade years, sponsored targeted programs and curated experiences, assisted students in acquiring school uniforms, offered tutoring services, and seminars for the girls. One hundred percent of the girls graduated high school and seventy percent enrolled in college.

Creation and presentation of the Magnolia Blossom Awards to community leaders helped support organizations such as the Center for Black Women's Wellness, Hammonds House Museum and Resource Center, Carrie Steele Pitts Home, and Fulton County Juvenile Court.

The Chapter has provided transitional clothing and financial support for clients of the cascade House, a shelter for homeless women and children as well as conducted seminars there.

The Magnolia (GA) Chapter focuses its efforts on five facets, which include: Services to Youth, National Trends and Services, International Trends and Services, The Arts and Health and Human Services.

Through our National Trends and Services, we continue to focus on the impact of human trafficking and support agencies in the changing of laws and the move to eradicate ALL human trafficking.

Through our International Trends and Services facet, we support schools in both Jamaica and Africa to improve learning and sanitary conditions, which earned recognition and a monetary grant at the Southern Area conference.

Through The Arts and Health And Human Services, we expand educational opportunities and experiences for both the community and the chapter. The impact of our programmatic






